- 3. **Use Relatable Details**: Just as a painter uses delicate brushstrokes, include specific, relatable details in your narrative. This could be a cherished object, a daily routine, or a meaningful place.
- 4. **Create Vivid Imagery**: Use words to paint pictures, like a photographer capturing a scene. Describe settings and actions vividly to transport readers into the story.

- 5. **Employ Direct Quotes**: Think of quotes as the subject's voice in a choir, adding depth and authenticity. Use them to convey personality and direct emotion.

- 8. **Keep it Authentic**: Maintain the story's authenticity, like a historian preserving the truth. Avoid exaggeration or sensationalism.

Factor Daily Media Lab - मानव-केंद्रित कहानियां बताने के लिए दिखाओ, मत कहो चेकलिस्ट

- 1. कहानी की जान खोजो: वो किस्से ढूंढो जो दिल को छू जाएं।
- 2. पात्रों को जानो-पहचानो: लोगों की कहानियाँ, उनकी इच्छाएँ और भावनाएँ समझो।
- 3. रोचक बातें बताओ: ऐसी छोटी-छोटी बातें जो आम लोगों से जुड़ी हों।
- 4. चित्रों जैसा वर्णन करो: अपने शब्दों से एक तस्वीर बनाओ।
- 5. सीधे बातें कहो: लोगों के अपने शब्दों का इस्तेमाल करो।
- 6. भावनाओं का सफर दिखाओ: कहानी की शुरुआत, मध्य, और अंत में भावनाएँ जोड़ो।

भावनाओं का सफर दिखाओ:

- बतानाः "सुनीता ने अपने डर को मात दी।"
